This work involved fisheries research and stock assessment for ICES working groups. The work also involved coordination and management of a Fisher Self sampling program in the Irish Sea, with particular emphasis on spatial and temporal discard measurement tools.
- As a fisheries consultant her principal area of expertise was in relation to stock assessment and ecosystem impacts of both artisanal and commercial fisheries. Her work involved evaluation and verification of fisheries management and sustainability against international standards such as the IFFO, FAO Responsible Fisheries Management and Marine Stewardship Council assessments in Iceland, Alaska and Ireland.

SUMARIS Sustainable management of rays and skates



- During three years the project SUMARIS will be lead in Belgium, France, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom and involves producers organisations, fishermen organisations, scientific institutes, a cluster and an aquarium.
- The main aim is to look forward a sustainable and cross-border management strategy for rays and skates stocks.
- As rays will be subject to the Landing Obligation (LO) from 2019 onwards, the SUMARiS project will anticipate the rays' LO, by encouraging fishermen to adapt their fishing strategies, and release rays alive at sea when needed.







First accomplished steps



- Communication strategy (Newsletter, Video, ...);
- Stakeholder contact list;
- Data format agreed & data call launched for the database;
- The RAMP method for the survival test considered;
- The framework & the coverage of the seatrips settled.










