**Subject: Signature of grant agreements between the Commission and Advisory Councils in 2021**

Dear Advisory Councils,

2021 is the beginning of a new financing period, which funds, including those related to Advisory Councils, will be covered by the EMFAF (European Maritime, Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund) Regulation<sup>1</sup>. This regulation was subject to a consolidated agreement between the European Parliament and the Council in last December, but is still not formally adopted, which means that the signature of financial grants to the ACs are to be postponed by a few months.

This will of course affect only the ACs, which start their financial exercise at the beginning of the year<sup>2</sup>. To make it possible for the ACs to function properly despite the late adoption of the EMFAF, we have included a specific provision in the EMFAF providing for an exceptional retroactivity of expenditure from 1st January 2021 for the operating grants to Advisory Councils. However, **the eligibility will start from the moment we receive a formal application**. Therefore, we encourage all of you to do as if the EMFAF had already entered into force, and to apply in conformity with the starting date of your exercise. Thanks to the exceptional retroactivity rule for the ACs in 2021, you can go on with your activity and expenditure. We will start examining the applications as soon as we receive them. Only the signature of grant agreements will be delayed to around mid-2021, when the EMFAF and the financing decision enabling grants to Advisory Councils are adopted.

As already announced in 2020, we will keep in 2021 the same amounts as in 2020, which are reminded here below.
