




FISHERIES COMMUNITY PROFILES EWG 24-05 + EWG25-02



- Place-based, around fisheries harbours, but can pertain to wider geographical areas.
- Where fisheries generates social & economic benefits
- Enables successive generations of fishers: shared norms and ways of life. Grow into/grow up as a fisher
- Likely to include fisheries-based organizations and ancillary industries in aquatic food value chains, as well as fisheries and maritime cultural heritage



COMMUNITY FISHERIES PROFILES

3 test (NL, FR, ES)

- Top priorities (state of play, generational renewal, dependency, and asssement of management measures) + other priorities/emergent issues (NFP, field work).
- Field work, consider groups other than the usual suspects
- It feasible (time and resources), enrol in a fishing trip with fishers. If not, try to get a walk through with any person involved through the whole value chain
- If there is a fisheries festivity (cultural, gastronomic, etc), try to do the field work during that period.

SOCIAL DATA CALL

Social data shall be collected **every three years**, counting from 2017 as the first reference data year.

- Employment by gender
- Full Time Equivalents by gender
- Unpaid labor by gender
- Employment by age
- Employment by level of education
- Employment by nationality
- Employment by employment status: Employee, Owner, Unknown

TEST STUDIES. What for?

- Following the recommendations from the STECF EWG 24-05 on "Social data" and RSCECON-ISSG meeting "Exploring options for data collection for new social variables" this test study aims to explore the feasibility and opportunity of informing social indicators by including new variables in the DCF.
- 12 indicators aligned with the four main priorities defined by DG-MARE, Member States and other stakeholders: state of play, dependency, generational renewal and assessment of management measures.
- Output: generate social data and further methodological developments.
- Duration: 2025-2027

Expected outcomes

- Methodology on social data collection for the 12 indicators. How to gather and analyse the data.
- List of data sources and -if applicable- survey sampling strategies and techniques.
- Quality check and analysis of data gathered.
- Analysis: Provide a better understanding of the variables explaining generational renewal, dependency, state of play, and measurement of socioeconomic impacts of policy measures.
- Application: Support operationalization of social variables and crosscomparison across EU countries to inform national, regional and EU policymaking.


