



Rules for advice on fishing opportunities



The advice rules applied by ICES in developing advice on fishing opportunities depend on:

- management strategies agreed by relevant management bodies
- the information & knowledge available for the stock


Advice will be based on one of the following:

- Management plan
- MSY approach
- Precautionary approach

- The F ranges in the MAPs are consistent with the ranges provided by ICES in 2015 ($F_{MSYlower}$ and $F_{MSYupper}$).
- F ranges evaluated to result in no more than 5% reduction in long-term yield compared with MSY.
- The ranges are considered precautionary:
 <5% probability that the stock size will fall below Blim.

Impacts of COVID-19

- Data collection and preparation
 - In general, some reduction in observer and market sampling of catches.
 - A few surveys were cancelled (e.g. UK (E&W)-BTS-Q3 in 7.a; SIAMISS-Q2, NIMIK); other surveys partly affected or delayed (e.g CGFS).
 - Some delays with data transmission but no major impacts.
- Working groups and advice preparation
 - All ICES meetings have been conducted online.
 - no meetings were cancelled.
 - benchmarks were particularly challenged.
 - working across time zones, inclusion issues.
 - online meetings until at least 31 October.





Impacts of COVID-19



- Impact on advice
 - Reduced sampling may have affected some estimates (e.g. discards, catch distribution, weights at age).
 - Impacts of missing surveys examined through sensitivity analyses.
 - in general, no serious impacts noted because more than one survey used to assess the stocks. (except sole in 7.a).
 - Impacts of COVID-19 documented in advice.
 - Returned to a modified full advice sheet (excludes stock status and information from stakeholder).




BREXIT



- ICES and UK signed a Memorandum of Understanding that became effective January 1, 2021.
- Continued collaboration of UK scientists in ICES work in 2021.
- Continued coordination of research surveys.
- Headline advice on stocks where both EU and UK have jurisdiction now based on MSY approach (EU MAP included in catch scenarios).
