FOCUS GROUP Western Waters Multi-Annual Plan Consultation

Printworks – Dublin Castle
Thursday 17th September 2015, 11:00 – 12:30

1. Welcome and introductions

Bertie Armstrong welcomed members, Commission and Member State representatives, and observers to the meeting.

The agenda¹ was adopted as drafted.

The Chair explained that the purpose of the meeting was to draft a response to the Commission Consultation on Western Waters Multi-Annual Plans (see link). This Consultation was aimed at the general public as well as fisheries organisations, NGOs and all other stakeholders. The original deadline for the response was 11th September, but in consultation with the Commission it was agreed that the NWWAC could respond by 12th October. Additionally, Terms of Reference were to be drafted for the Focus Group dedicated to draft the response.

2. Presentation on the STEFC pre-assessment regarding the impact of MAPs in Western Waters

The Secretariat (Barbara Schoute) presented the conclusions from the STECF report on Multiannual management plans for SWW and NWW (STECF-15-08).

3. AC response

In the preparation for the discussion at the meeting, two documents had been prepared – one following the consultation document with general questions and one summarising the main points on the topic. Both documents had been drafted from a different view point that of the industry and 'other interest groups'. In order for the meeting to agree on the component parts of the response to the consultation a presentation was made based on points from both documents.

The meeting agreed that the nature of the questions was very general which made it difficult to use the consultation document as a basis to present an AC position. It was noted that although there were some points of agreement on possible answers, there was a need to develop a specific position for the NWW, possibly in a text rather than answering a vague, generic and badly constructed questionnaire. The group agreed that this was too important a subject to be rushed to conclusions.

After the initial discussion it was decided that the group could not reach agreement on answering the questions in the consultation at this stage. Those that had spent time on the preparation of discussion documents were thanked for their input and the Secretariat was asked to consider a different approach for this type of discussion in future, specifically the consideration of group size and the need to engage scientific experts during the meeting.

The evaluation by STECF provided a good basis for further work but it would take more time in a Focus Group to discuss these conclusions. A question that arose was the fact that the NWW were modelled using the Celtic Sea alone. The group considered that areas such as the Irish Sea and West of Scotland should be included as well to be more representative of the whole area and that it should include 'choke' species. Although the group agreed to draft advice in response to the more specific consultation that was referred to in the preface of the consultation document, the Commission (Mr Griffin) noted that there was no further consultation planned but would welcome the view of the AC on the matter.

4. Conclusions

The group agreed to:

- Draft a short response to the consultation (Secretariat / Andrew Clayton / Barrie Deas) to indicate
 the importance of the subject and the fact the NWWAC would need to spend more time to draft
 comprehensive advice;
- Plan a follow up process (FG WWMAP) to produce advice on Multi-Annual Plans in 2016. (Secretariat to set up process and ensure ToRs are drafted);
- Use the STECF report (agenda item 2) as the basis for a future NWWAC response, and request that the STECF extend their research to include at least the Irish Sea and West of Scotland. (Secretariat and chair to draft this communication to STECF for the approval of the Executive Committee).
