All concerned considered that a further review would be necessary immediately following the publication of the next round of ICES advice for Bass

Discussed at the meeting but not referred to by the drafting group was the need to consider compensation for fishermen and net suppliers in the event of rapid and extensive changes in the required mesh sizes, especially of drift and set nets that will be necessary to select out Bass of less than any revised MCRS.
