1. Chair's tenure of ExCom

NWWAC rules of Procedure:

40. The Chairperson of the Executive Committee,

To be known as the Chairperson of the AC, shall be **nominated** and elected by majority of the members of the Executive Committee for a (renewable) term of three years.

The Chairperson may be a member of ExCom or the GA.

The Chairperson shall play an impartial role.

If the Chairperson is drawn from the members of the Executive Committee, a substitute member shall be nominated in writing by the organization which the Chairperson formerly represented.

The Chairperson of the NWWAC shall not have a vote within the Executive Committee.

1. Chair's tenure of ExCom

The term of office for the vacant position will be ONE year to fit in with the terms of office of other office bearers (i.e. Working Group chairs)

1. Vice-Chair's tenure of ExCom

NWWAC rules of Procedure:

41. The Vice Chairperson(s) of the Executive Committee,

To be appointed by the members of the Executive Committee for a (renewable) term of three years. The Vice-Chairperson(s) shall be a member(s) of the Executive Committee and shall have a vote.

Nominations are invited from ExCom for these positions (also EFCA representatives)

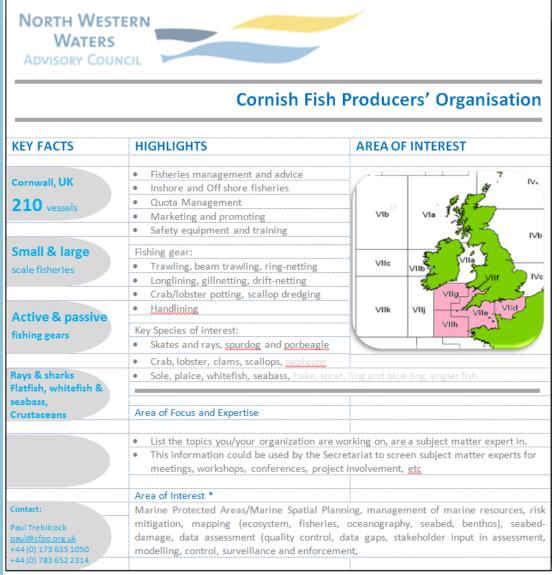

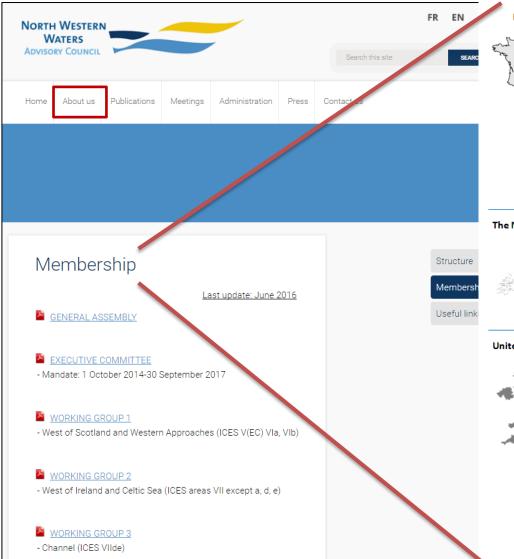

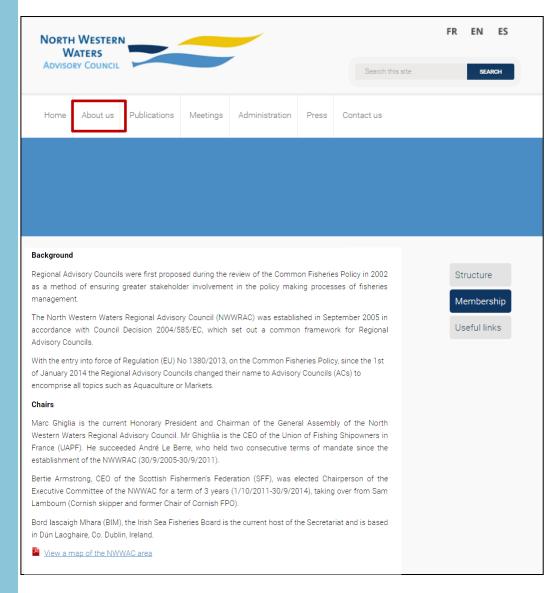

Detailed rules on the functioning of Advisory Councils

Preamble (6)

Small-scale fisheries play an important social, economic, environmental and cultural role in numerous coastal communities throughout the European Union. It is therefore necessary to ensure their efficient participation in the work of the Advisory Councils, including by contributing to the costs and loss of income that such participation may entail.

Art 4.6

The GA and the ExCom shall ensure a balanced and wide representation of all stakeholders, with emphasis on small-scale fleets, where appropriate. The number of representatives of small-scale fleets should reflect the share of small scale fleets within the fishing sector of the Member States concerned.

Art 6.1

Each Advisory Council shall offer additional compensation to fishermen representing small-scale fleet organisations for their efficient participation to its work on top of the reimbursement of their travel and accommodation expenses. Such compensation shall be duly justified for each case.

Request (Doc 4)

The Irish Islands Marine Resource Organisation (IIMRO) applied for NWWAC membership -- May 2016

"As small-scale interests we have limited resources and would be grateful for your consideration of the need at [6] in the Preamble to ensure the efficient participation of small scale fisheries interests in the work of the Advisory Councils, including by contributing to the costs and loss of income that such participation may entail".

Key elements

Art 6.1

Each Advisory Council **shall** offer additional compensation on top of the reimbursement of their travel and accommodation expenses

to: fishermen representing small-scale fleet organisations

for: their efficient participation to its work

Such compensation shall be duly justified for each case.

Comments from other ACs

- Other Advisory Councils (ACs) have not received specific requests so far
- Suggestions:
 - Make sure of Level Playing Field between Acs;
 - Make rules flexible enough to account for differences between regions.
