- July/August 5 NGOs give notice of termination of NWWAC membership
- NWWAC ExCom Chair writes to resigning members
- NWWAC Secretariat invites resigning NGOs to upcoming ExCom meeting for wider discussion
- 11 September Discussion at meeting of Executive Committee
- 16 September NGO meeting held with Director-General Vitcheva

# Letter by ExCom Chair to Resigning Members

- Asking a more ample explanation about decision to give notice of termination of membership
- NWWAC Secretariat has made great efforts to address issues reported at inter-AC meeting in November 2019 and to increase the involvement of all members in the ongoing work of the NWWAC.
- Meeting in Madrid, March 2020, addressing the request to improve communications and discussing the ongoing issues as perceived by several Other Interest Group members.
- Basis for cooperation within the NWWAC structure confirmed at this meeting just prior to the full outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Consequences for work program took precedence over elaborating.
- Regretting that the development of solutions appears to have been cut short now by the resignations.
- Constructive attempt to join forces again in the NWWAC in the near future,

### **Issues reported by NGOs**

#### Letter to Director General July 2020

- Structure of ACs and implementation of the advisory process
- Impartiality of chair persons
- Inappropriate or hostile language from some AC members
- Not applicable to all ACs
- Need to re-evaluate the resources put into ACs
- Organisations that are leaving remain open to returning on a case-by-case basis if the situation improves sufficiently.

### **Issues reported by NGOs**

### Individual resignation letters and feedback at ExCom

- Choice of use of available time
- Disappointment on progress made on own priorities
- Imbalance between input and outcome
- No urgency in NWWAC to reach CFP objectives
- Most E-NGO work is to avoid deviation from CFP objectives whilst AC should facilitate implementation
- CFP implementation is failure
- Not clear why in some other ACs it works better than in NWWAC
- General Assembly members effectively relegated to the role of observers in many AC processes if they are not ExCom members
- Inherent imbalance in structure of ACs in favor of the industry
- NWWAC often failed to achieve its function of providing balanced, consensual advice

## **Conclusions / Actions**

- E-NGOs consider this was amply discussed in NWWAC, other ExCom members felt only first discussion on 11 Sep => Issues not sufficiently addressed at right forum
- Forum for discussion and improvement is limited within the NWWAC as 5 NGOs are leaving and thus unclear how to participate in further discussions
- Find forum and include NWWAC secretariat overview of OIG involvement in the work.
- ExCom members and departing OIGs have been requested to send suggestions to the NWWAC Secretariat => same request to GA and WG chairs
- AC request to Commission for a joint meeting with AC Secretariats, ExCom Chairs/Vice-Chairs and E-NGOs to identify a way forward.
